## **NONPARTISAN AND OTHER ELECTIONS HELD IN CONJUNCTION WITH PRESIDENTIAL PREFERENCE PRIMARIES**

1972 – Two amendments to the Florida Constitution; and three straw poll questions

1976 – One amendment to the Florida Constitution; a school bond election; and political party committees

1980 – Two amendments to the Florida Constitution; a public poll about emergency medical services; and political party committees

1984 – One municipal election – Largo; and political party committees

1988 – Four municipal elections – Indian Shores, Kenneth City, Redington Shores and St. Petersburg

1992 – Seven municipal elections – Clearwater, Largo, Indian Rocks Beach, Oldsmar, Redington Beach, Redington Shores, Safety Harbor; and Indian Rocks Fire District

1996 – Eight municipal elections – Belleair, Clearwater, Indian Rocks Beach, Kenneth City, Largo, Redington Shores, Oldsmar, St. Pete Beach; and Palm Harbor Fire District

2000 – 15 municipal elections – Belleair Beach, Belleair Bluffs, Belleair Shore, Clearwater, Indian Rocks Beach, Indian Shores, Kenneth City, Largo, Madeira Beach, Oldsmar, Redington Beach, Redington Shores, Safety Harbor, St. Pete Beach, Tarpon Springs

2004 – 14 municipal elections – Belleair Beach, Clearwater, Gulfport, Indian Rocks Beach, Madeira Beach, North Redington Beach, Oldsmar, Pinellas Park, Redington Beach, Redington Shores, St. Pete Beach, South Pasadena, Tarpon Springs, Treasure Island

2008 - One amendment to the Florida Constitution; a school board tax referendum and five municipal elections - Clearwater, Gulfport, Redington Shores, Safety Harbor, South Pasadena

2012 – Five municipal elections – Clearwater, Kenneth City, Safety Harbor, St. Pete Beach and Tarpon Springs

2016 – 11 municipal elections – Belleair, Clearwater, Gulfport, Indian Rocks Beach, Madeira Beach, Oldsmar, Pinellas Park, South Pasadena, St. Pete Beach, Tarpon Springs and Treasure Island (Dist. 4)
